Get Into Water Grant Report (Pier, Cowan)

- HRO Open Forum to be held January 20 – also considering a HR track at the conference
- Executive Forum to take place on January 28 by invitation only
- Steve Frank is coordinating a job shadow at Metro for a video titled ‘What I Want to Be When I Grow Up’.
- Representatives have been attending Colorado Water Wastewater Facility Operators Certification Board meetings because of concerns on the criteria required for certification and how it is set up. Mel Fahrenbruch will prepare a letter addressing it to WWFOCB and mail it to CECTI and C&D Council on behalf of RMSAWWA and Sectors concerning the minimum age to sit for an operator certification exam plus making the exam more available.
- Sylvia Rottman explained the requirements set by EPA, State Statutes and Regulations regarding operator certification. A Regulation change can take 9 to 10 months. She also described the current application process for operator certification.
- Deadline for the AWWA Education Award is February 1st.

Colorado Water Utility Council – Sean Lieske from City of Aurora Water is the new Vice Chair of WUC. Sean will participate in the Fly In. Chris Piper of Denver Water will represent CWUC for the Fly In as well.

Awards Committee – The committee recently met. The committee is working with Heidi Bauer on a new student chapter award.

Action Now Committee – Teams will check with the Holiday Inn to see if it is possible to move up the March Montrose seminar by one week to avoid overlapping with the Grand Junction water wastewater conference. February Action Now will be at the Embassy Suites in Loveland. The mailing for the January Canon City agenda was recently sent. The committee will be requesting support from the Section bookstore allotment.

Publications Committee - At the February Winter Planning Meeting Paul will present more detail on a joint website which will be especially helpful for the Joint Annual Conference and Joint Committees. Bud O'Hara has announced his retirement and his last day at Pueblo Water will be July 29. The Board discussed the opportunity to have advertisement or sponsorship posted on the future joint website. The Colorado Water Utility Council is pleased to provide input to the preparation of the budget for the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, specifically for the Water Quality Control Division.

Reliably clean drinking water is a valuable asset to Colorado. It supports many facets of our lives as Coloradans from recreation to business to tourism, and provides for basic domestic needs. In Colorado, the agency responsible for monitoring and protecting drinking water sources as well as assuring that safe drinking water is provided by public and private water systems is the Water Quality Control Division.

Since clean drinking water provides a state wide benefit to the general public in Colorado, we consider it to be appropriate to use general funds to support the activities of the Water Quality Control Division. We urge the JBC to retain the current level of general funding to the Division. Doing so will also help ensure that the Division is able to utilize significant federal matching funds.

The Colorado Water Utility Council is an alliance of drinking water providers from throughout the State of Colorado organized under the auspices of the Rocky Mountain Section of the American Water Works Association. Our membership is concerned with federal and state laws, regulations, and policies that can affect our ability to provide an adequate supply of high quality drinking water to the general public. At the present time, our membership serves treated water to over 80 percent of the population of Colorado located on both the east and west slopes of the Continental Divide. It is the purpose of the Council to comment on legislative matters that directly affect water utilities in Colorado.
